OFFICER DICKEY
We just need it as a formality.

ETHAN
Ah. "Formality." Ethan McClain.

OFFICER DICKEY
Ethan, do you know why we called you down to meet with us?

ETHAN
I have an assumption that it's got something to do with this Turd Burglar I keep hearing rumblings about.

OFFICER DICKEY

we knew we were on to something.
